Setting the Stage for Your Episode

Thank you for your interest in being a guest! Below are our podcast guidelines to help you prepare for a potential interview with our Host, Rich Rinnisland.

- **Recording Setup:** We use Zoom for our recordings. Please ensure you're ready at your device using the Zoom link provided in your email once scheduled.
- **Time Allocation:** Each session is typically scheduled for an hour, which includes some prep time. The actual recorded segment usually ranges from 25 to 45 minutes.
- Audio Quality: For optimal sound quality, we recommend using a headset (earbuds with a mic, AirPods, or an external mic).
- Environment: Choose a quiet setting for the interview.
- **Relax and Enjoy:** Consider it a friendly conversation rather than a formal interview. Feel free to share stories related to the topics discussed.
- **Recording Notes:** Please note that our recordings are not live. If needed, you can pause and restart. Natural responses are encouraged over perfect answers.
- **Preparation:** Listen to at least two published episodes of the podcast to familiarize yourself with the host's style and format.
- Anticipated Timelines: We often record episodes in advance and release them later in the season. We will communicate with you regarding your episode's release date, which is guaranteed to be within the current season.

Helpful Tips

We encourage natural conversations! Podcasts can have detours — that's what typically makes them compelling.

Requirements

- Dress Appropriately: Dress in a way that reflects how you want to be perceived.
- Stable Setup: Use a stationary desk or computer setup; joining via cell phone or tablet is not permitted.
- Environment: Choose a quiet location with no noise, with a clean and professional background. If you do want to use an uploaded background, we ask you use a green screen.
- Good Webcam: Use a high-quality webcam to ensure clear video.
- Lighting: Ensure adequate lighting so you are clearly visible.
- Visual Components: Consider how you present visually, as screenshots or video clips may be used.
